Kittanning, Pennsylvania March 30, 2023

The Board of Supervisors of East Franklin Township met in the Municipal Building at 6:00 p.m. for the March 30, 2023, regular meeting.

PUBLIC COMMENTS:

Update - Intersection of State Route 422 and Glade Run Road - Larry Richardson, **Zoning Officer** – I talked with a representative from PennDOT (District 10). PennDOT is moving forward with efforts to make passing through the intersection less of a risk for motorists. At the present time, there is a project out to correct the pavement and do intersection painting on the pavement. The state intends to apply painted traffic warnings known as optical speed bars, which would be designed to catch the eyes of motorists more efficiently to make them aware of the need to curtail the speed as they approach the intersection. The lines would start about 1,000 feet out, go the whole way across the highway and they increase in volume as you get near the intersection. So, the closer you get to the intersection, the faster you look like you are going. PennDOT also intends to place a device known as a speed minder, which would rest on a portable trailer near the intersection. The speed minder will be placed every four to six weeks starting April through September for four or five days at a time. Also, a work order is in the works to better position stop signs at the intersection. PennDOT has also requested the Pennsylvania State Police be assigned to sit at the site and evaluate traffic flow via radar. Another option would be for PennDOT to install high-resistance pavement. Referencing a road study audit conducted by Southwestern Pennsylvania Commission (SPC), they could install a concrete barrier down the medial strip so a left-hand turn will not be allowed. Cross traffic would need to find an alternative route.

Gracie Elosser - Resident of Glade Run Road - When will the work commence?

Larry Richardson, Zoning Officer – PennDOT did not give a date.

Sara Southworth, Resident – Fox Hollow – I am here again to address Chickadee. Some of the roads in the plan have never been paved. Last time I was here It was said we needed a cul de sac. I did talk to the PennDOT liaison for the township. He said an agreement should have been made with the developer years ago. I am asking if the township can talk with Scott Hooks (developer) to see what can be done. Even without the cul de sac the road needs to be paved.

PUBLIC COMMENTS (CONTINUED):

- Barry Peters, Chairman We did talk to Scott Hooks about two years ago. Where the cul de sac is proposed, there is a high-pressure gas line that we cannot cross over. Right of ways need to be acquired at the end of the road to build the cul de sac. I will get in contact with Scott Hooks.
- Spurgeon Shilling I have currently been with Armstrong County Sewage Enforcement since 2007. It made up of a board of supervisors which David Stewart currently sits on the board. In the last couple years township and board members have been dissatisfied with the way it has been handled and monthly fee for the townships to belong. The townships were charged fees starting in 2009 when the funding was cut. I have gone out on my own as a sewage enforcement officer. I am here to offer my services. There would be no fee to the township. Current sewage permit with sewage enforcement is \$1,000. My fee is \$1,200 which the township would receive \$100 from the fee.
- Barry Peters, Chairman We will get back to you when we come to a decision.
- Charlie & Cindy Kennedy Our neighbor is still burning all hours of the day. I have pictures, dates, and times.
- **Larry Richardson, Zoning Officer** I sent him and the landlord a letter. Send me the pictures I will take care of the problem.
- Matt Kutch, West Hills Emergency Services The Board previous approved a referendum to be placed on the ballot to propose a fire services tax. We were informed by the Armstrong County Election Board the referendum will not be allow because it is under three mills. The Board would have to vote on adding a fire tax. We are asking the board to consider a 1 mill fire tax.
- **Debra Cornman, Secretary/Treasurer** The Supervisors have until October 2023 to authorize a fire tax for tax year 2024.
- **Matt Kutch, West Hills Emergency Services** What about the fire ordinance for recovery of costs.
- **Barry Peters, Chairman** We received a memorandum from our solicitor that the fire company can bill the insurance carrier on their own or through a third party, but they cannot compel payment. The township does not have the authority to recover costs.
- **Matt Kutch, West Hills Emergency Services** We understand but the ordinance may help us recover some of the cost.
- **Debra Cornman, Secretary/Treasurer I** will revise the ordinance and send to the Solicitor for overview.

PUBLIC COMMENTS (CONTINUED):

Chris Evans, Resident – We still have speeding on East Brady Road near the firehall. Can the township police petrol that section of road?

Steve Guelich, Police Officer – I try to petrol all areas of the township. I have been very busy on non-related traffic calls/violations.
